Absecon Creek Dredging

NEW JERSEY DEPT. OF TRANSPORTATION

Dredging operations have begun and will continue 12-hours-a-day, six-days-a-week, Monday to Saturday, through the end of November 2021. An estimated 70,000 cubic yards of sediment will be removed from the channel. The channel will be dredged to a depth of six feet at low tide with an allowable overdredge of one foot.

NJDOT's contractor, Severson Environment Services, Inc., has been working since May 11, 2021, to place pipeline in and near the channel, which will be both submerged and floating, in preparation for the dredging operation. The pipeline will be used to pump sediment to the Gateway Dredged Material Management Facility.

Channel use may be limited where the dredge is in operation and where the pipeline is carrying dredged material to its placement locations. Full channel closures are not expected, although this is subject to change.

Dredging in this area will create a safe passage for boaters and operators who rely on the channel. I am grateful to everyone's tolerance and flexibility as we make our waterways safe to pass. This project is forecasted to be completed by the end of

this year and I for one am happy that our fishermen and boating recreationalists will be able to navigate safely for many years to come.

In other news, the City has been able to procure a new firetruck for our volunteer Fire Department that will replace the aging ladder truck. This vehicle is known as a "Quint" and is a fire apparatus that serves the dual purpose of an engine and a ladder truck. The name quint is derived from the Latin prefix meaning five, and refers to the five functions that a quint provides: pump, water tank, fire hose, aerial device, and ground ladders. This apparatus will join the other vehicles that are ready to serve our residents.

Finally, our Absecon residents love their pets especially their dogs and cats. This is just a friendly reminder to please be a responsible pet owner. Keep your dog on a leash when going for a walk and make sure you pick up the dog dirt your pet leaves behind. This is what being a responsible member of a community is about.

I am truly proud to serve as Mayor for this great community and hope you and your family have a wonderful, safe summer.

We are a month and a half into the official National Hurricane Season, and we have seen higher than normal tropical cyclone activity. This, following a year where Tropical Storms Fay (July 10, 2020) and Isaias (August 04, 2020) brought wind and rain to the community. And now in 2021, Claudette passed to our south in June and Elsa brought wind and rain to the city.

Be ready for hurricane season. Today you can determine your personal hurricane risk, find out if you live in a hurricane evacuation zone, and review/update insurance policies. You can also make a list of items to replenish hurricane emergency supplies and start thinking about how you will prepare your home for the coming hurricane season. If you live in hurricane-prone areas, you are encouraged to complete these simple preparations for hurricane season now. Keep in mind, you may need to adjust any preparedness actions based on the latest health and safety guidelines from the CDC and our local officials.

RECYCLING CARTS COMING SOON!

The City is excited to announce it will be providing one 96-gallon recycling cart to every household that receives curbside collection. The wheeled carts make taking out recycling much easier. They also come with attached lids that keep items contained, which will reduce wind-blown litter throughout the community. They also provide additional storage space so residents can recycle even more! As a result of a successful application to the Recycling Partnership, the City will be receiving a grant to offset part of the cost of the purchase. Cart distribution is expected to begin in September. Additional details, such as the guidelines and exact delivery dates will be announced soon!



The Atlantic County Utilities Authority (ACUA) is excited to announce that Atlantic County residents can place polypropylene, or #5 plastics, in their curbside recycling bins again. Polypropylene is commonly used in food packaging like single-use yogurt cups, iced coffee cups, and juice bottles. The change is a result of an up-turn in recycling markets and a new partnership with a state-of-the-art recycling facility operated by Mazza Recycling. ACUA continues to remind residents to please empty out any liquids or food from your containers prior to placing in your curbside bin.
